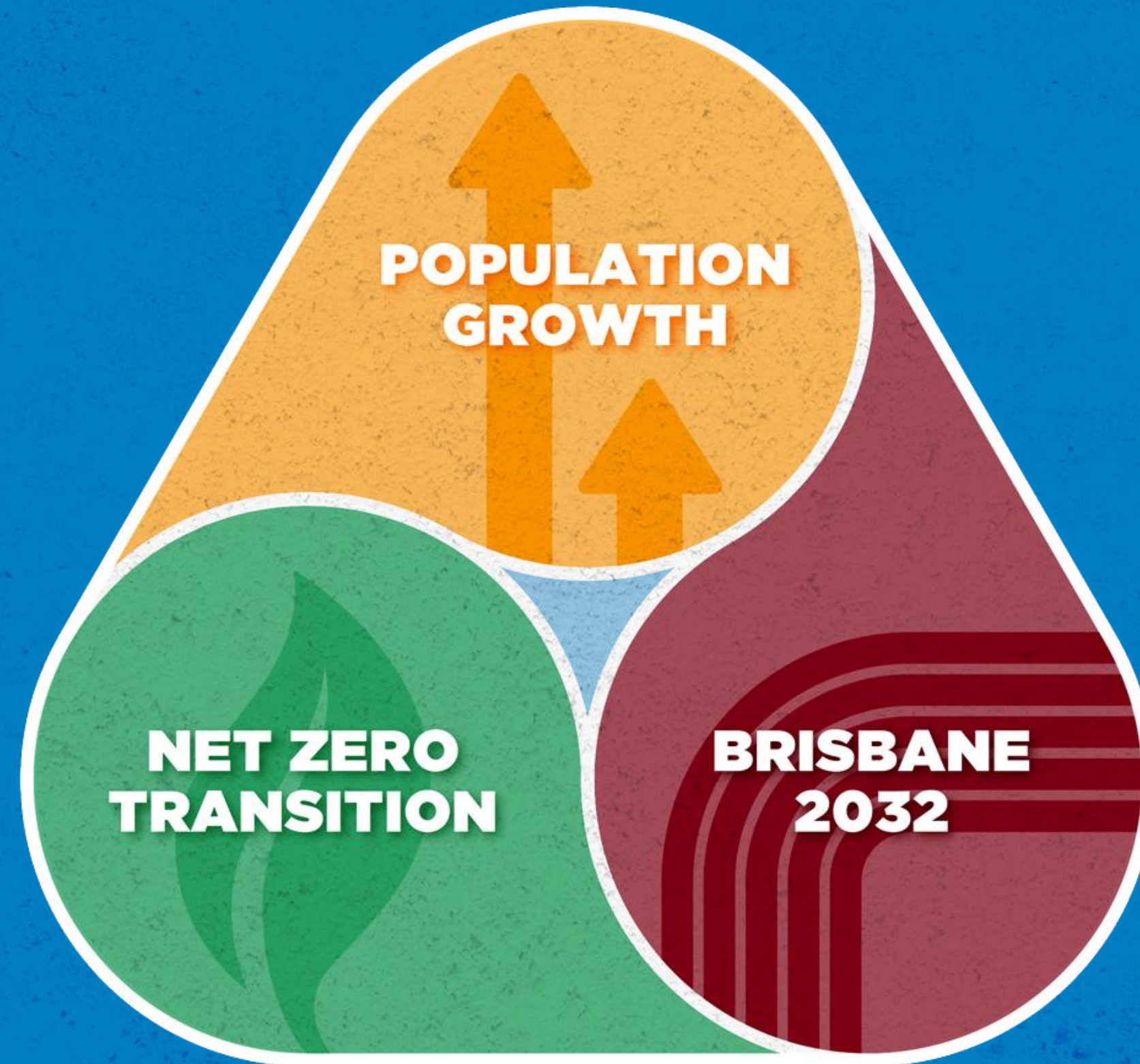

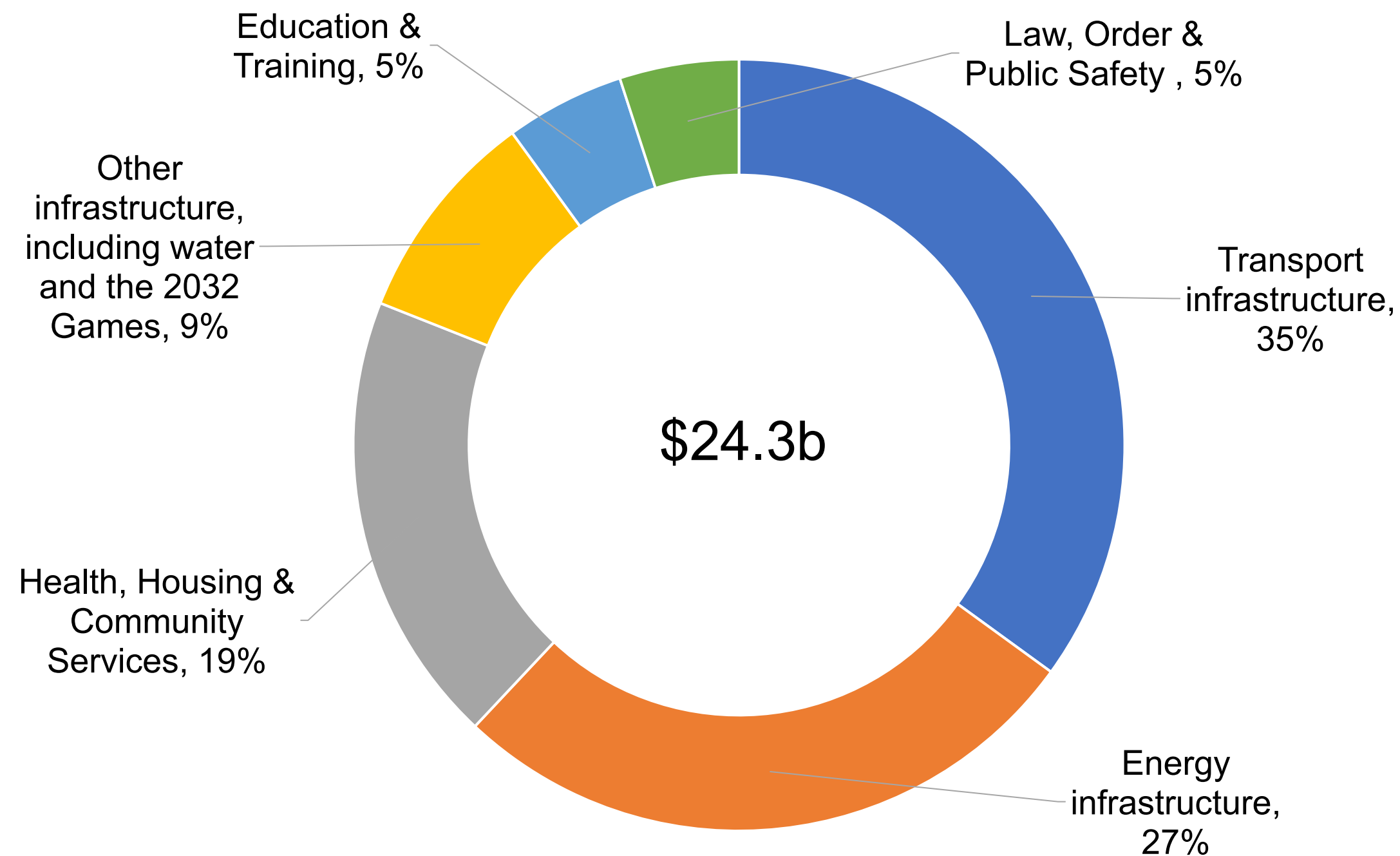

Key Drivers of Construction Activity, QLD



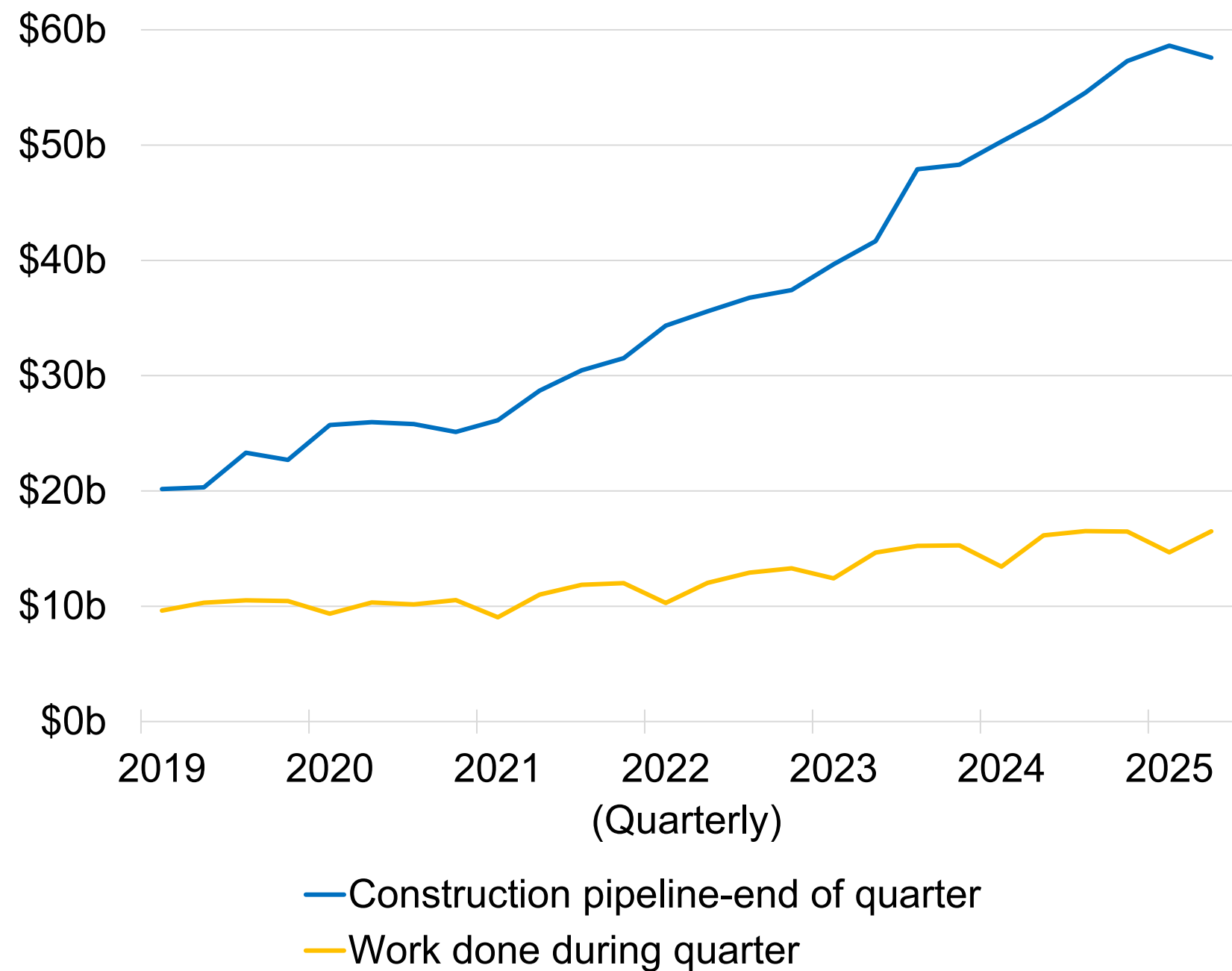
QLD Government Capital Purchases 2025/26

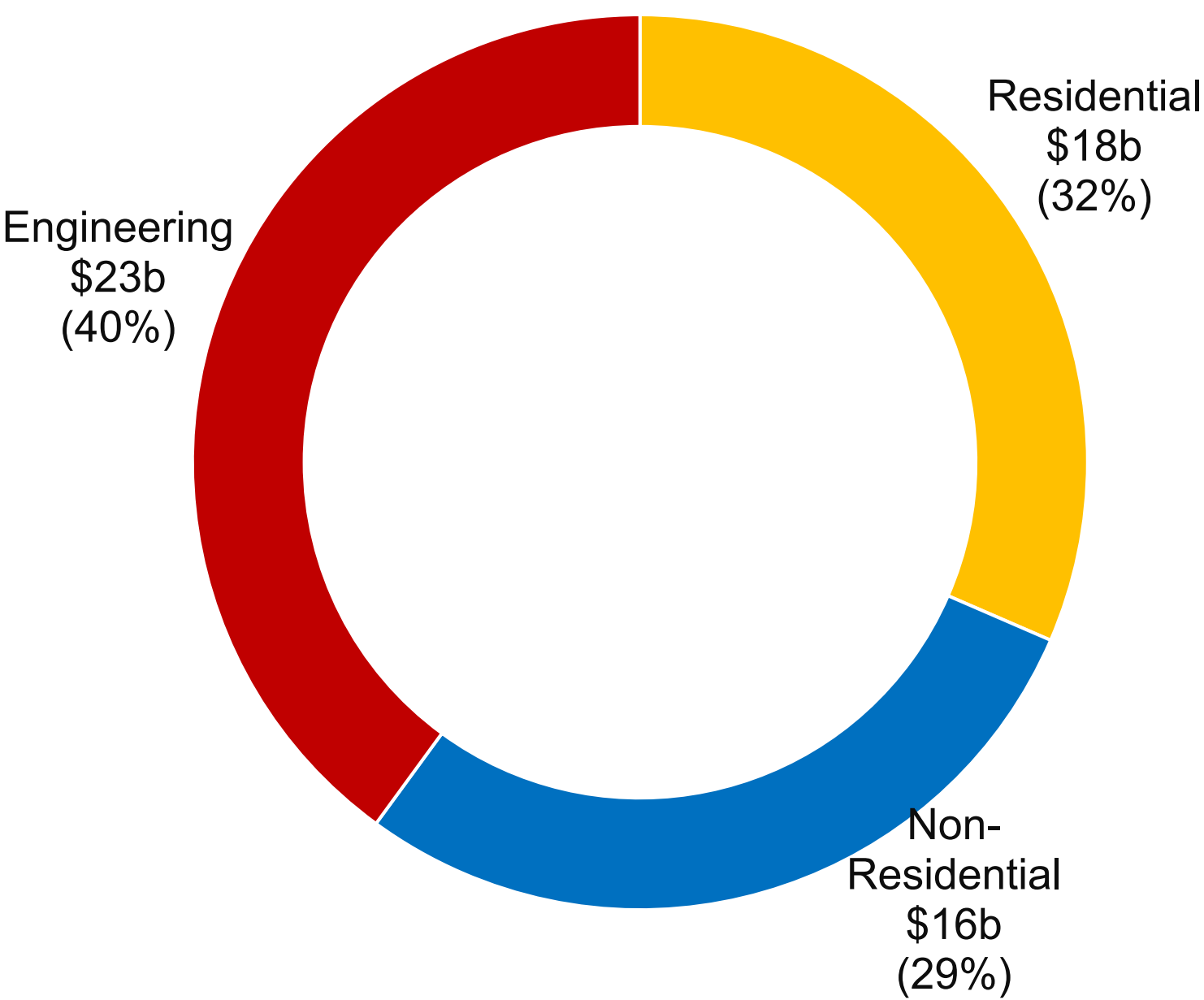
QLD Construction Pipeline

Pipeline & Work Done



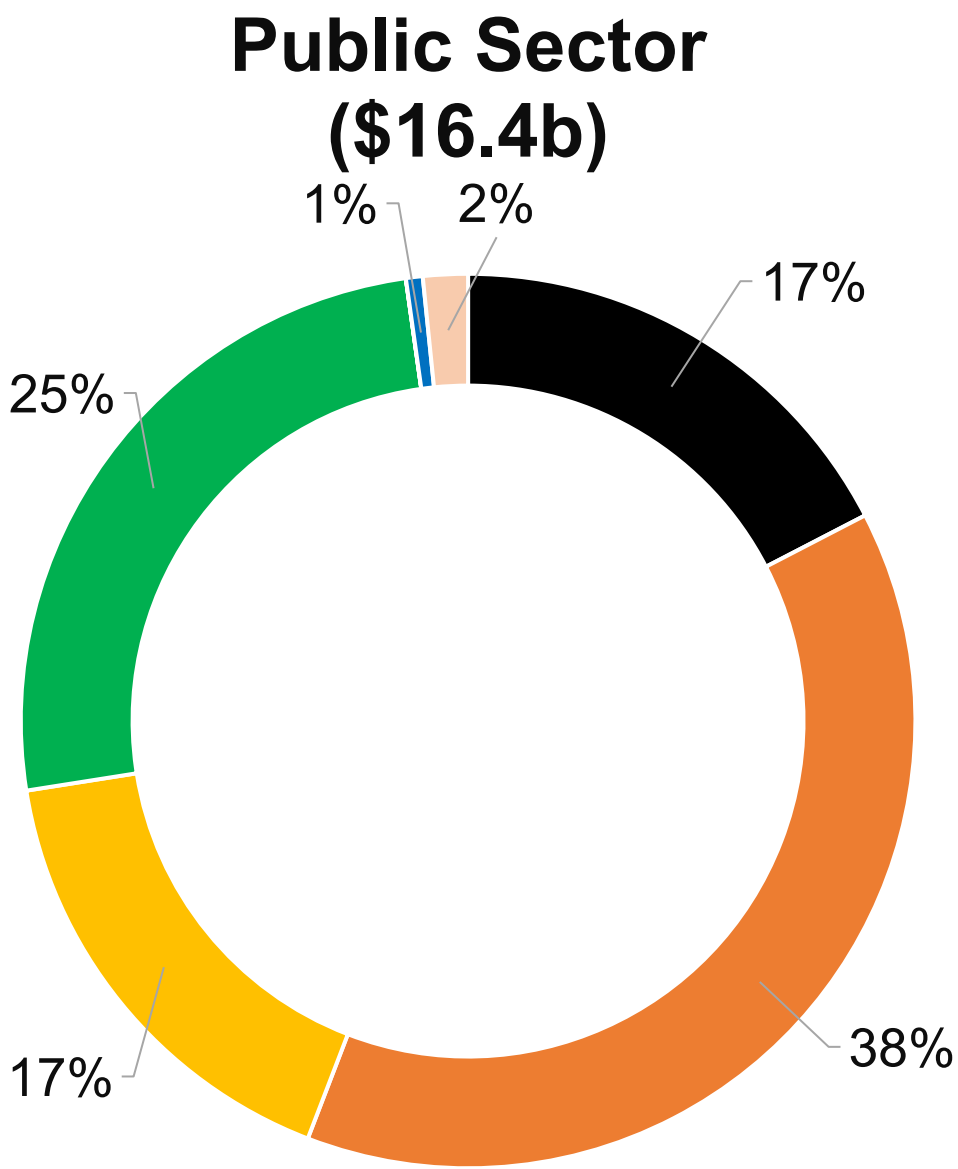

Pipeline as of June 2025: \$57.6b

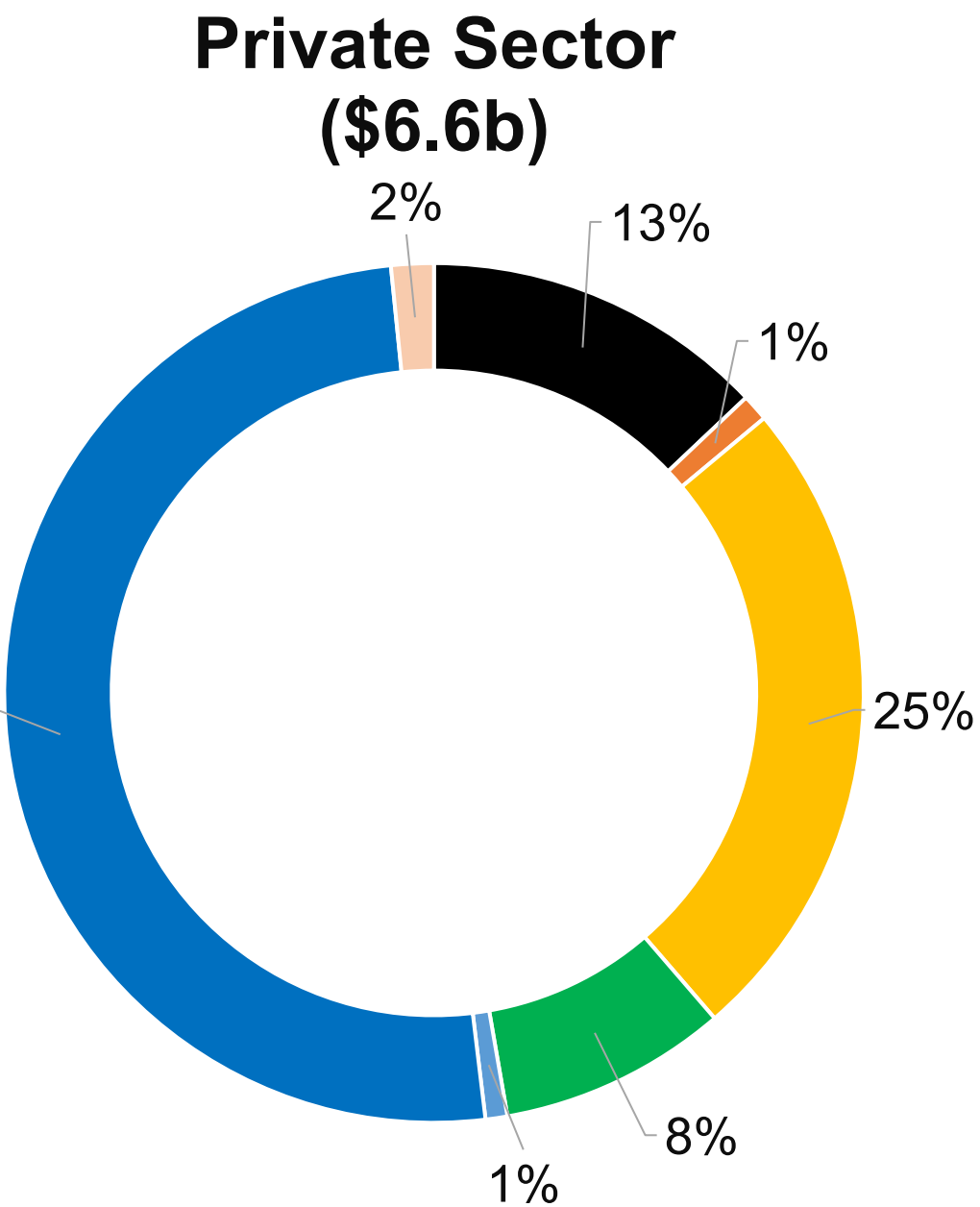

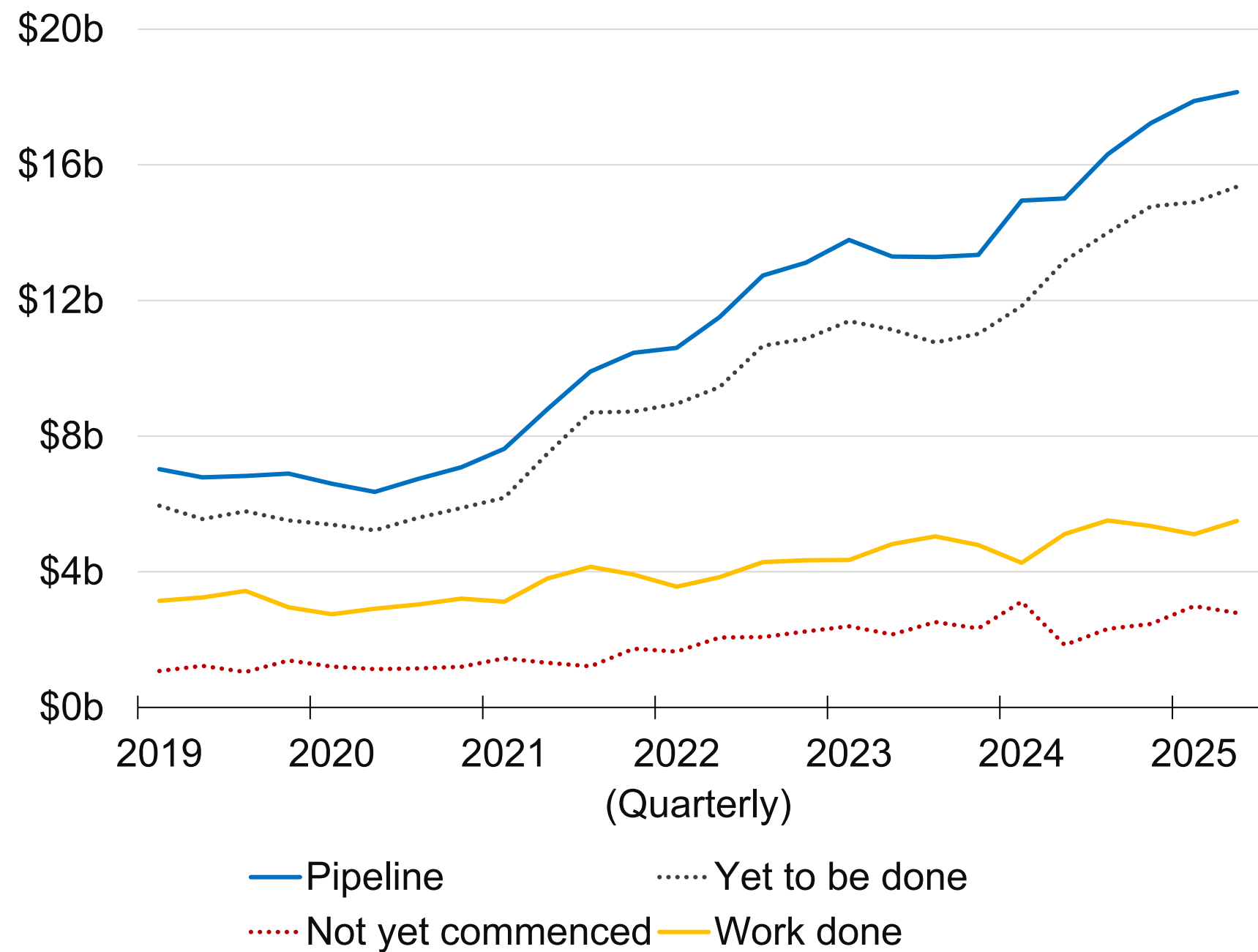

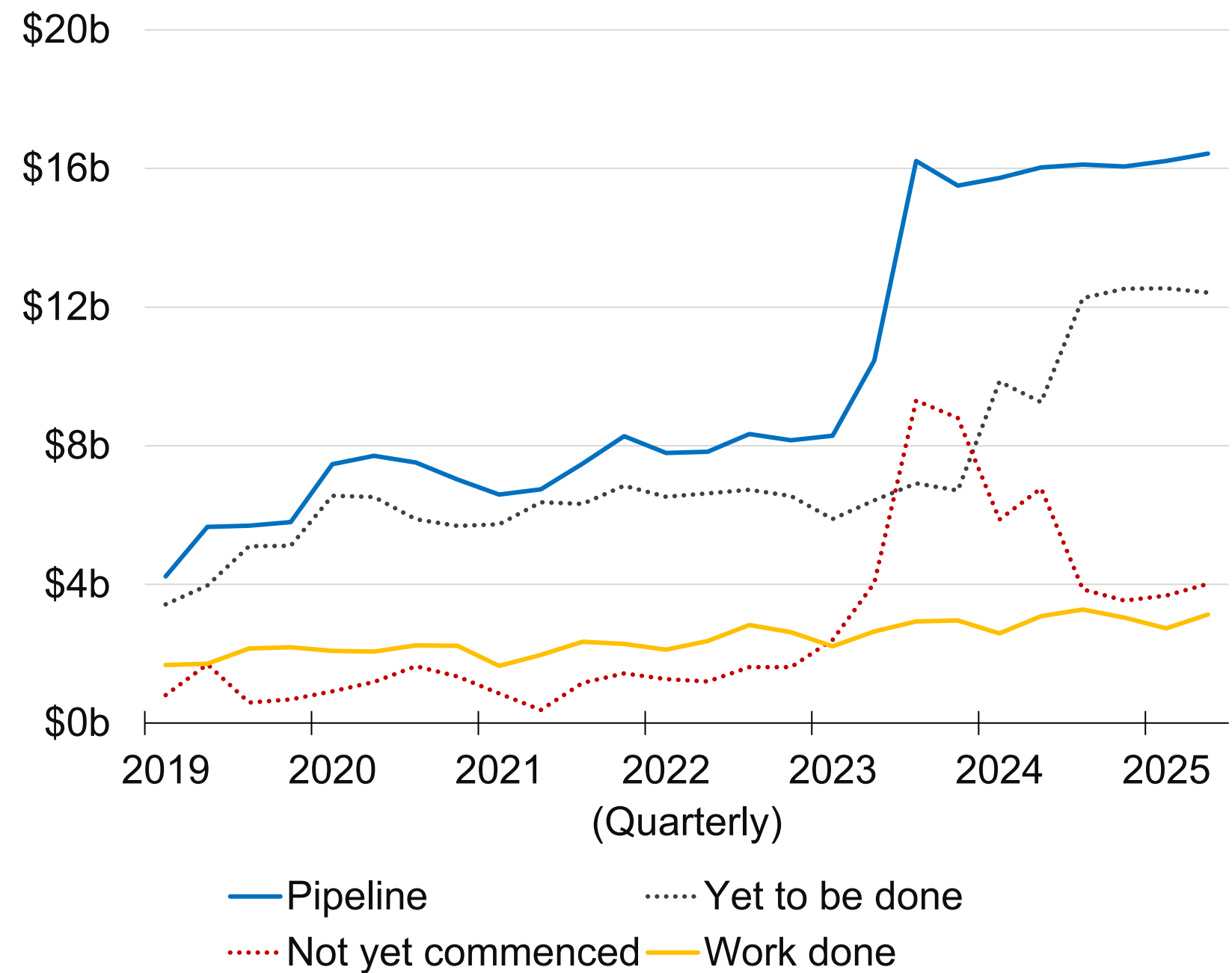
QLD Building Activity

Value of Non-residential Activity

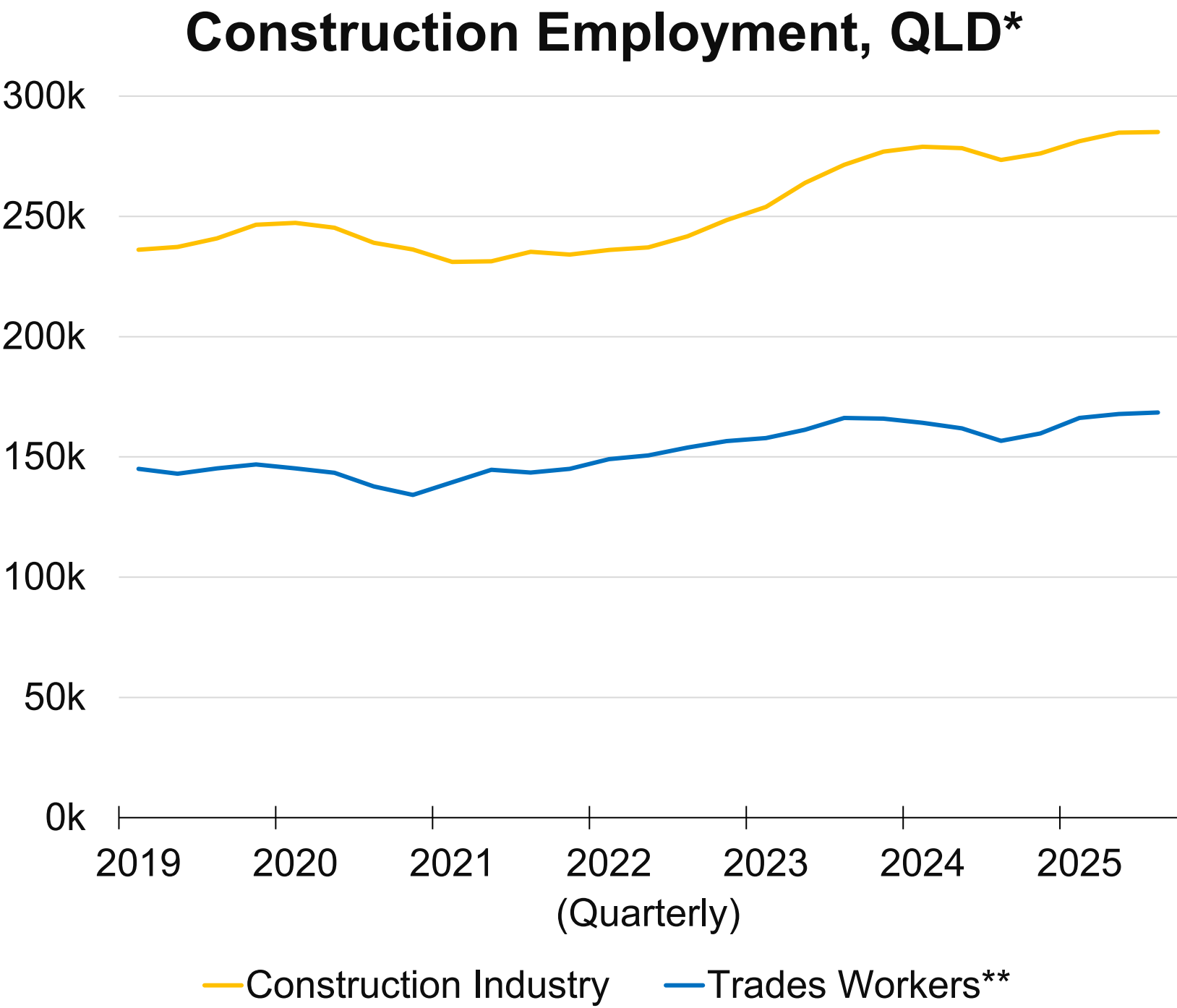

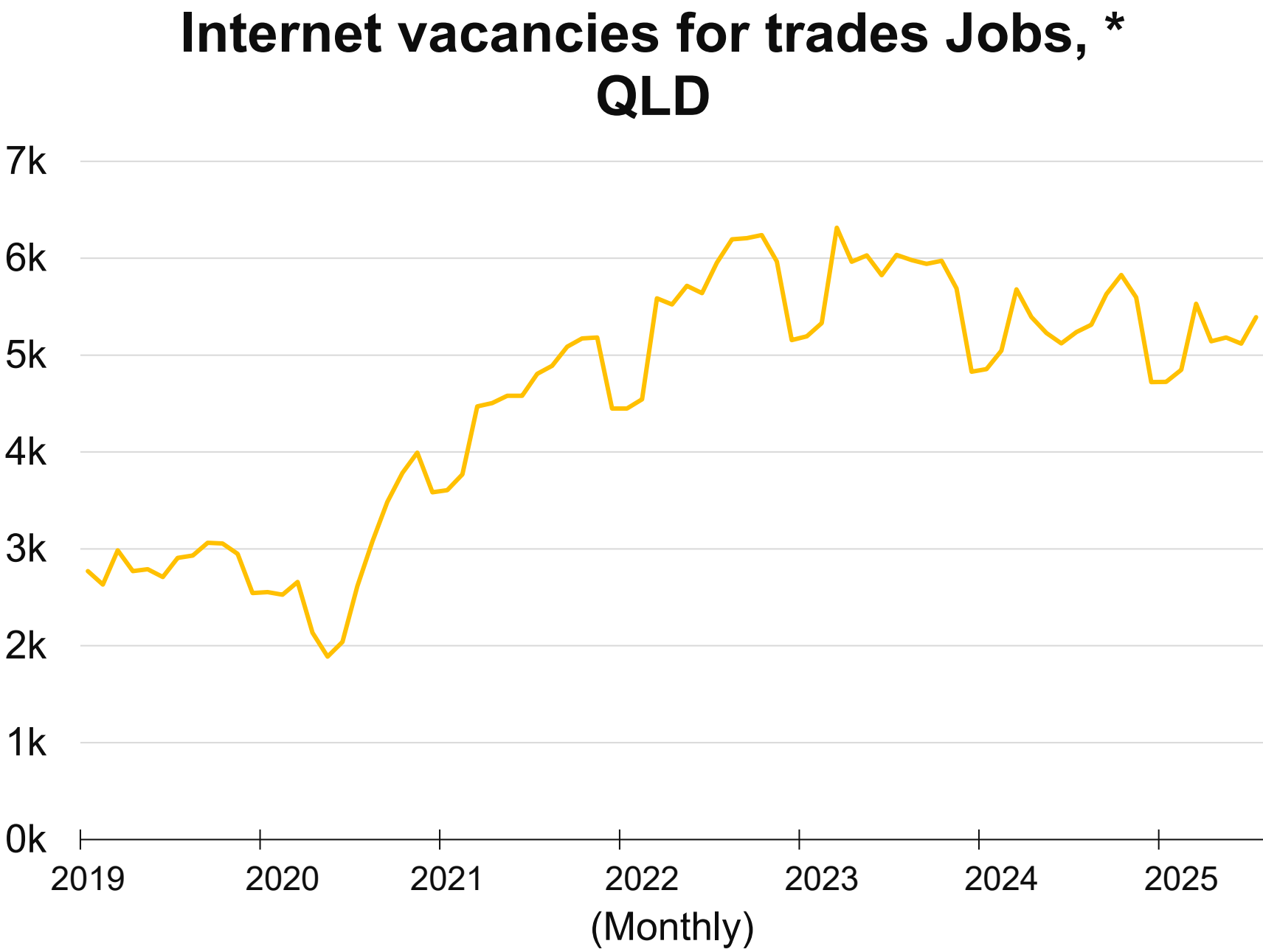

QLD Construction Employment

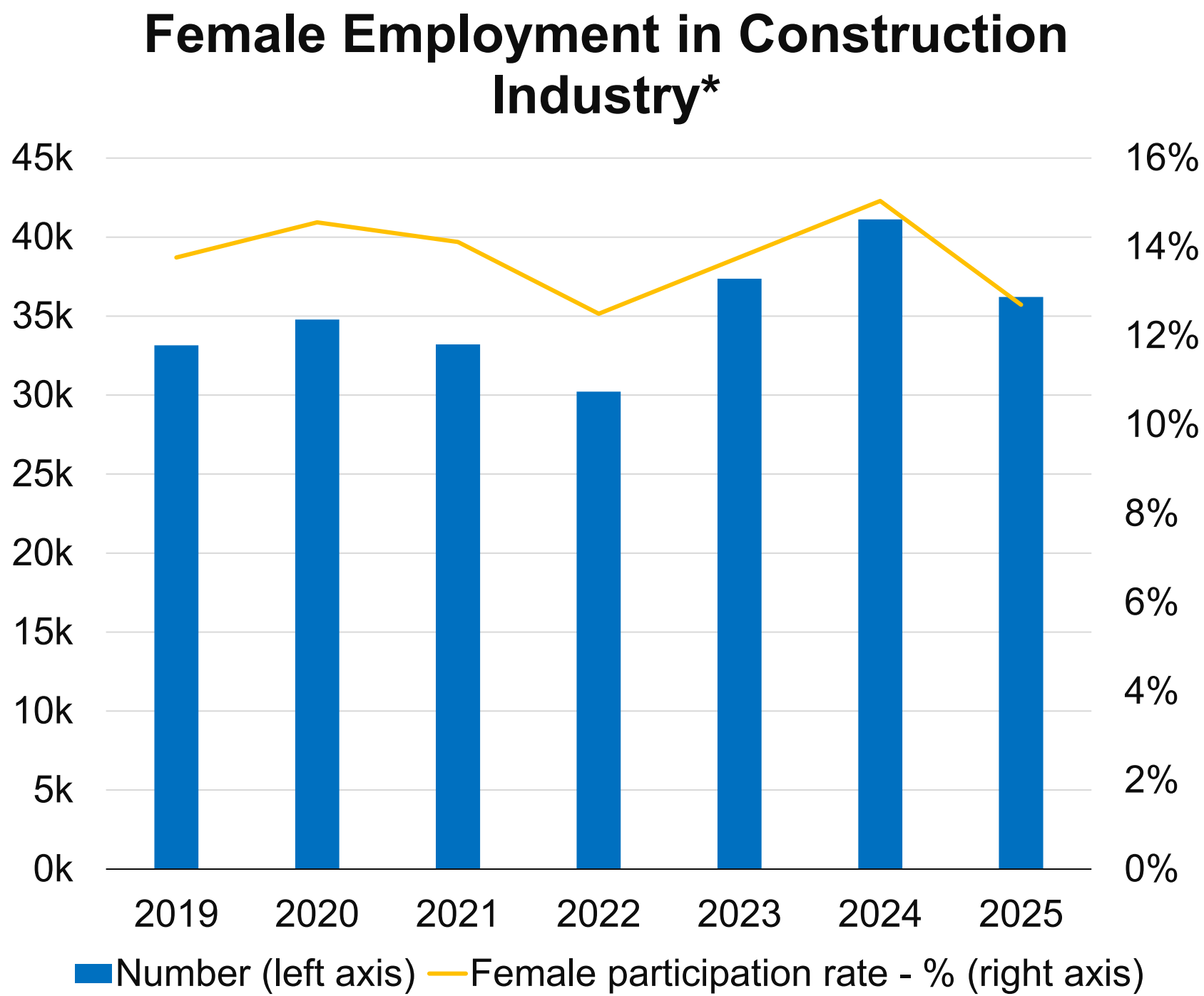

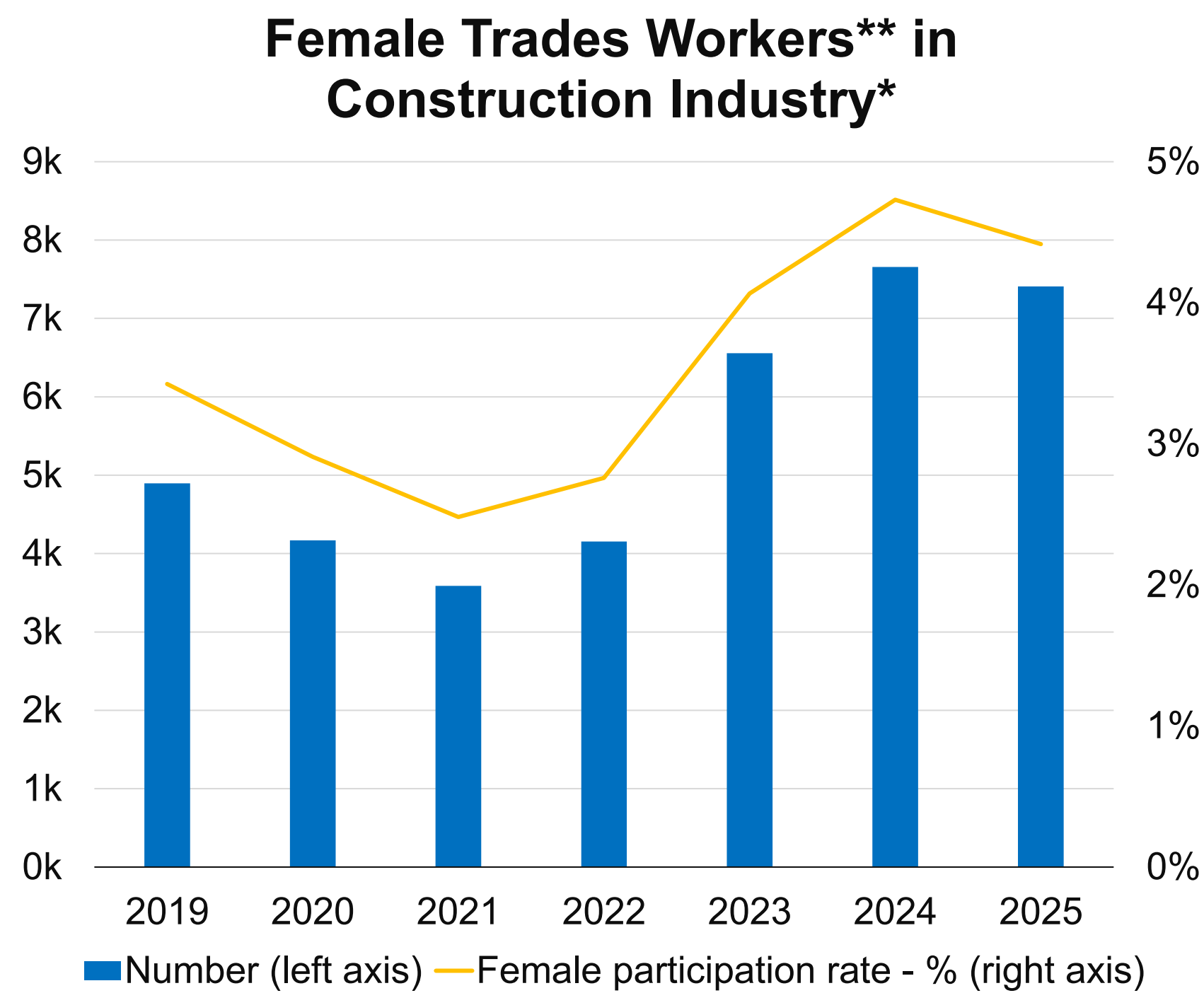

QLD Females in Construction

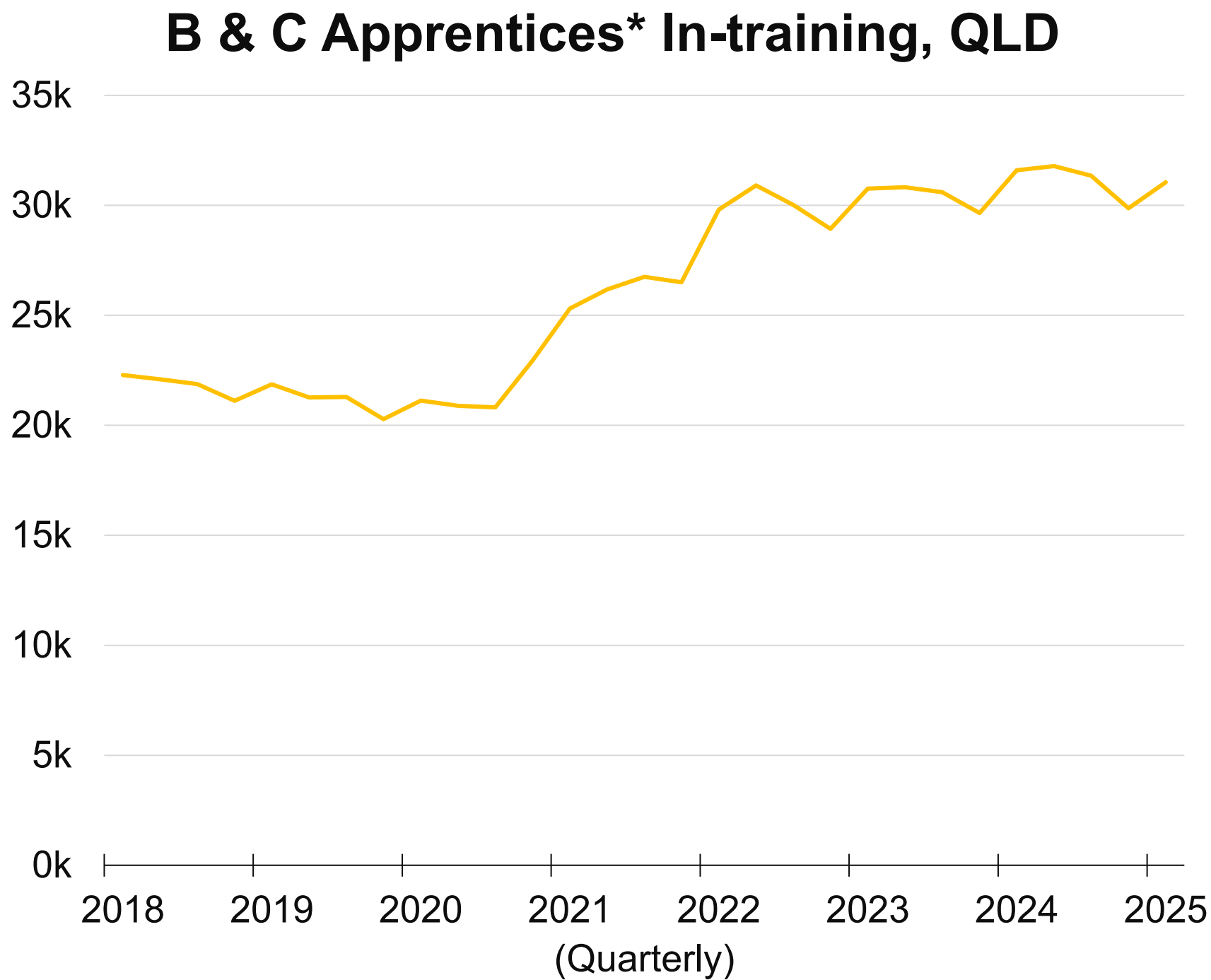

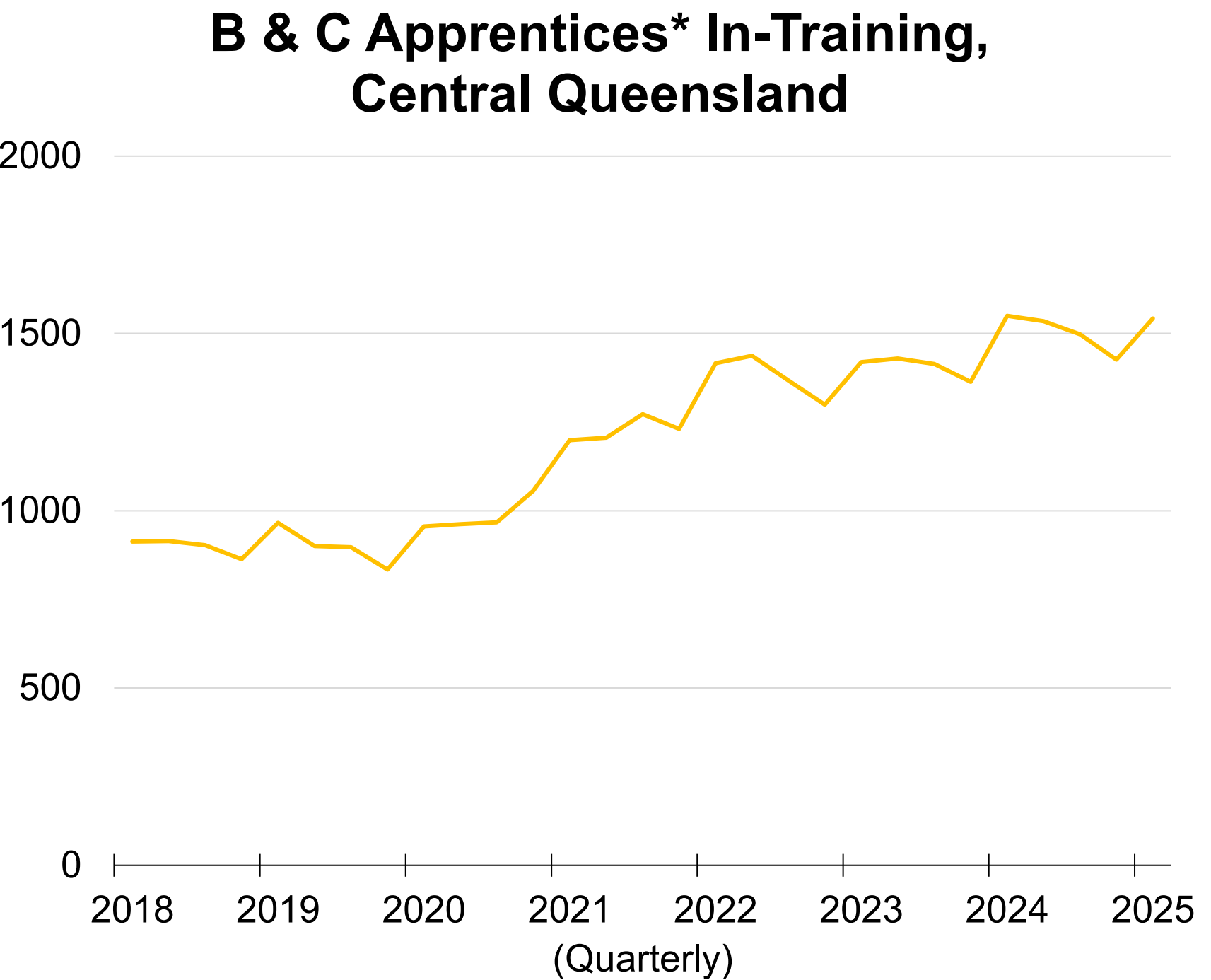

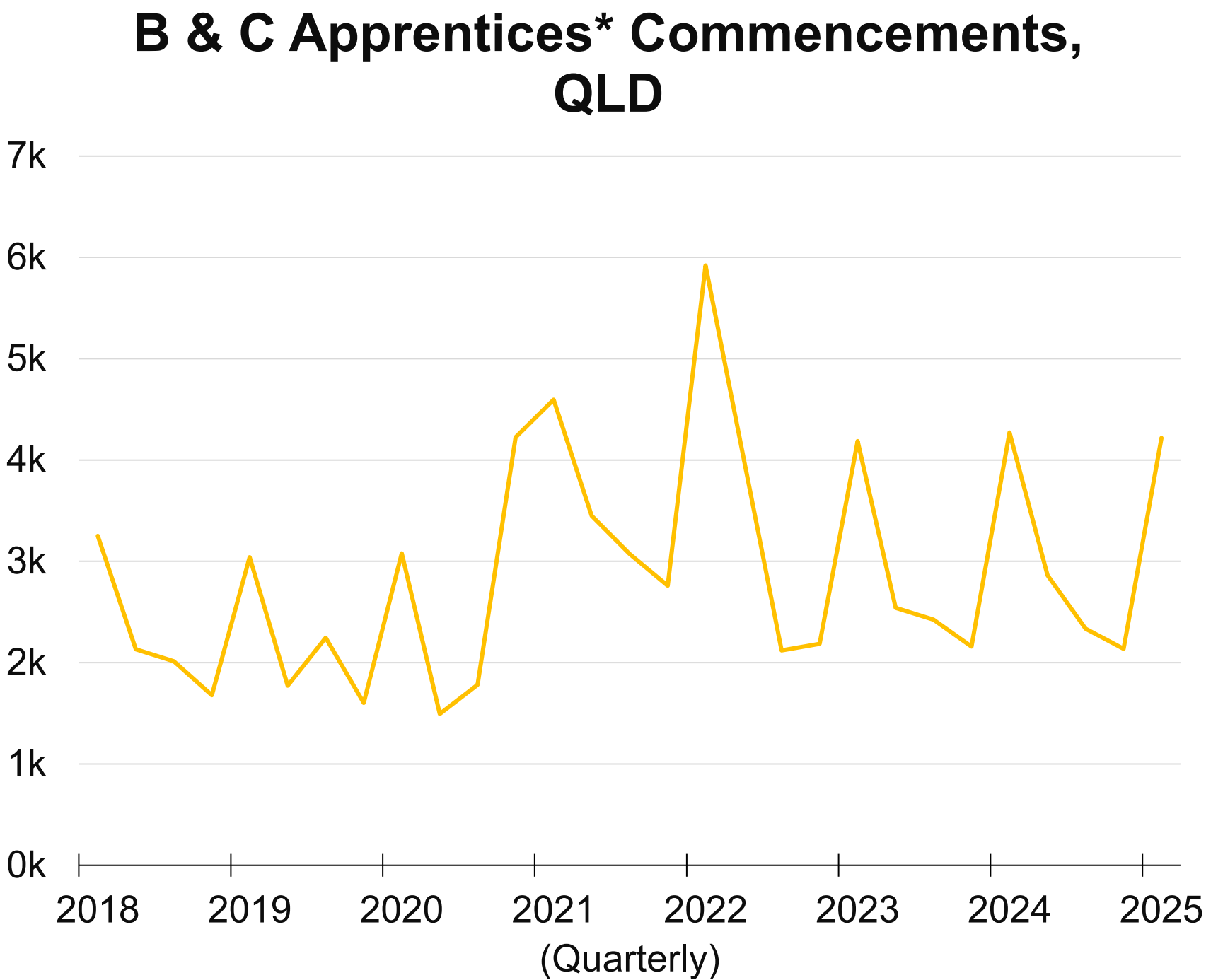

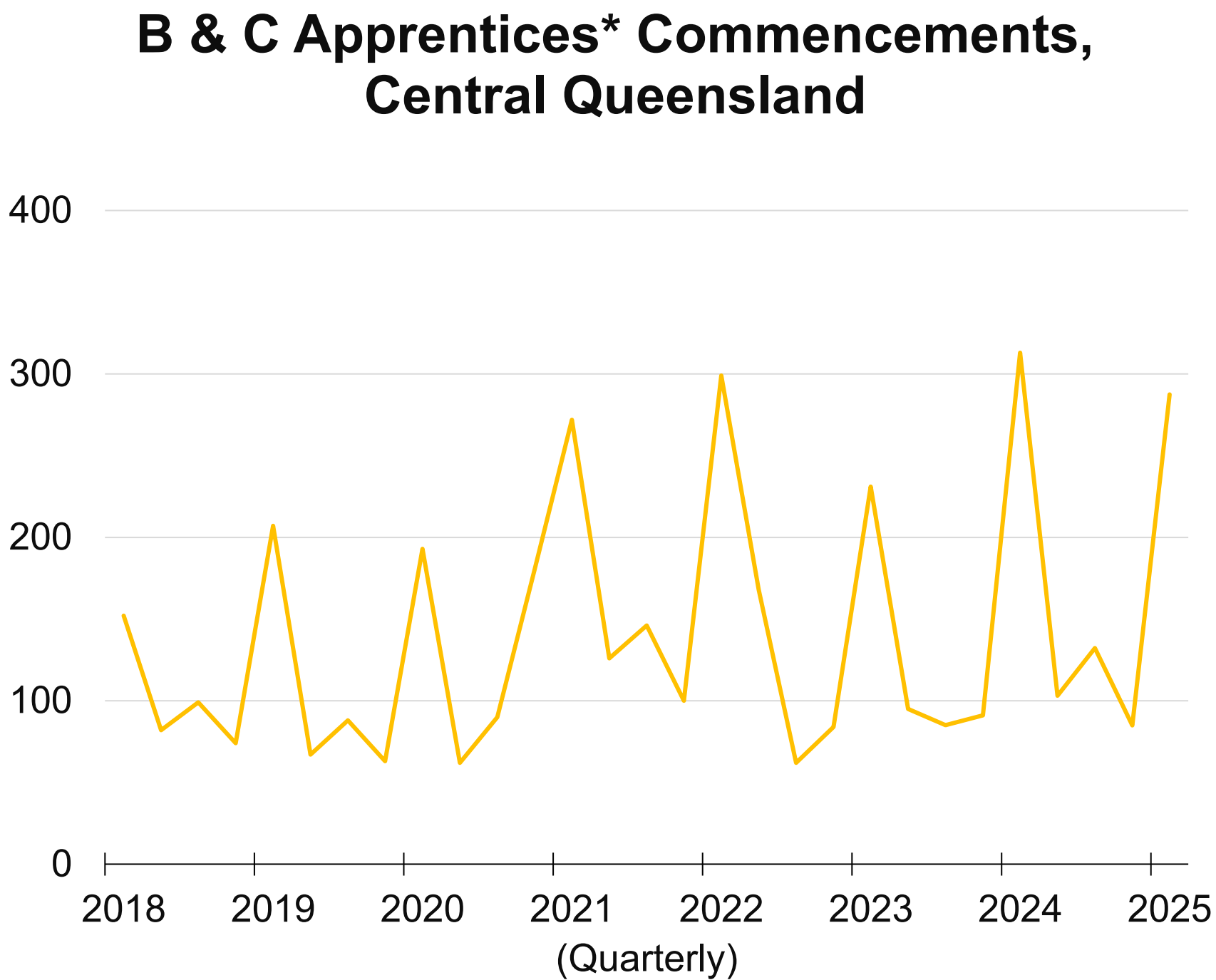

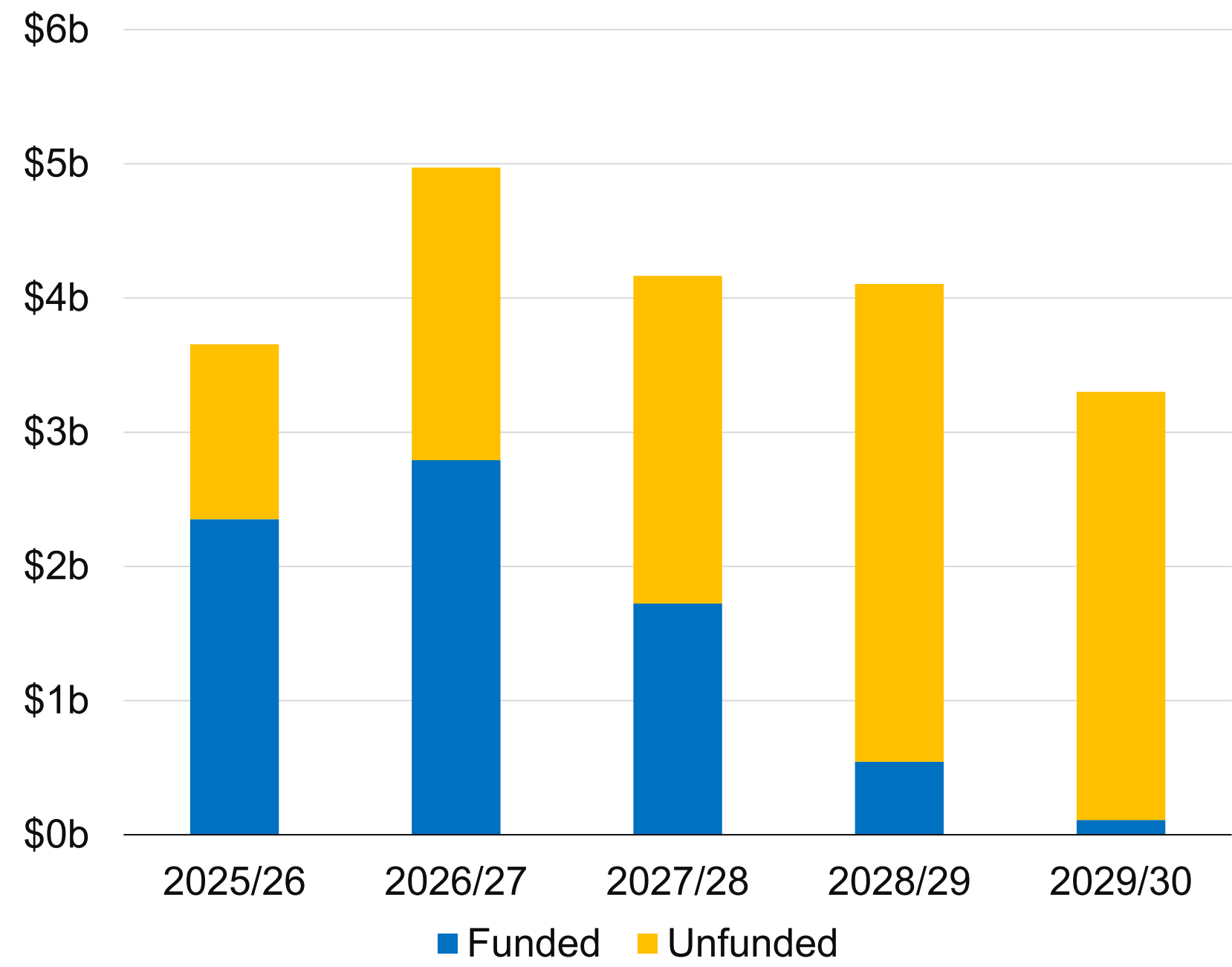

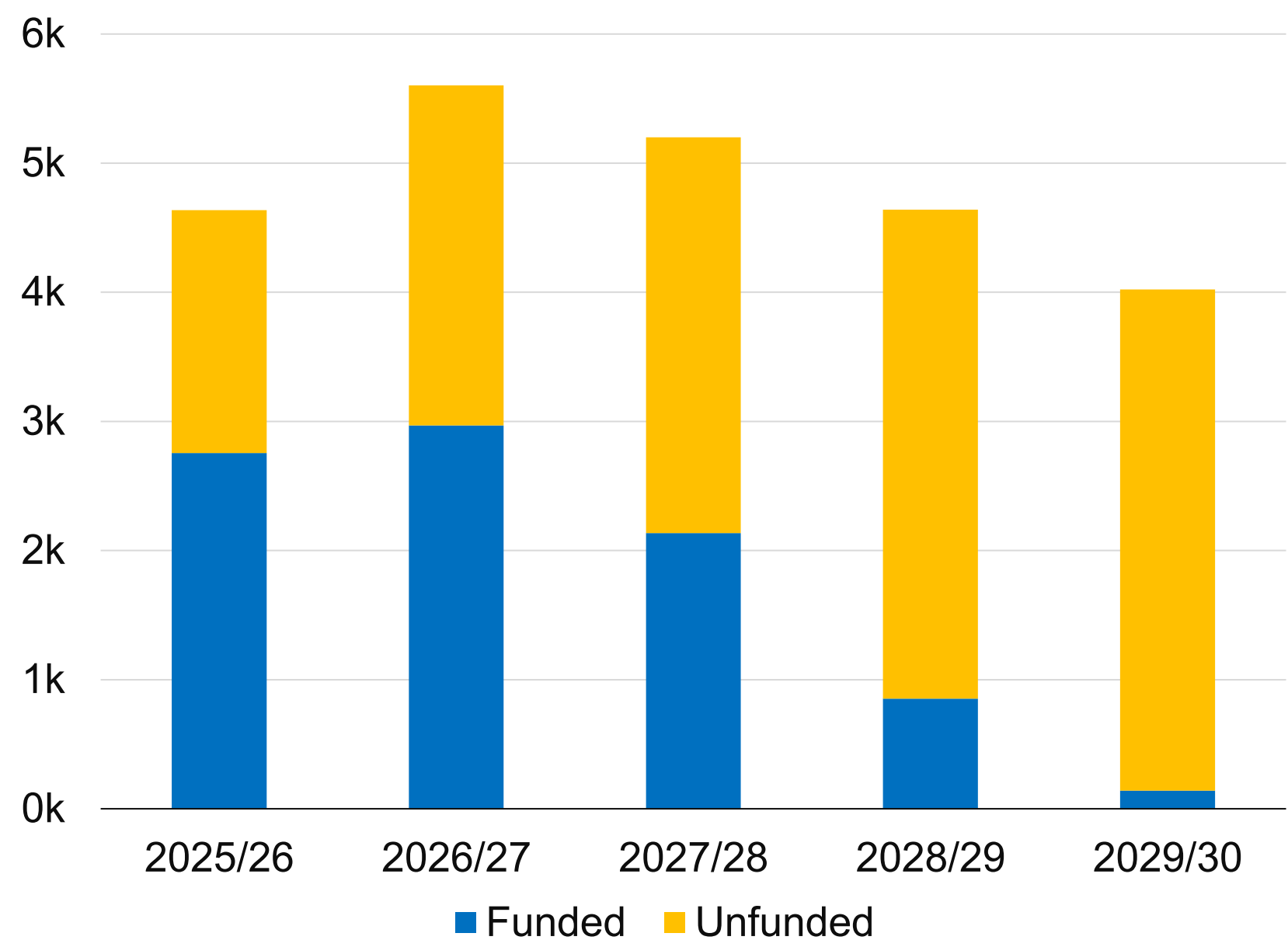
Average Labour Requirement: Central Queensland

QMPP, by funding status



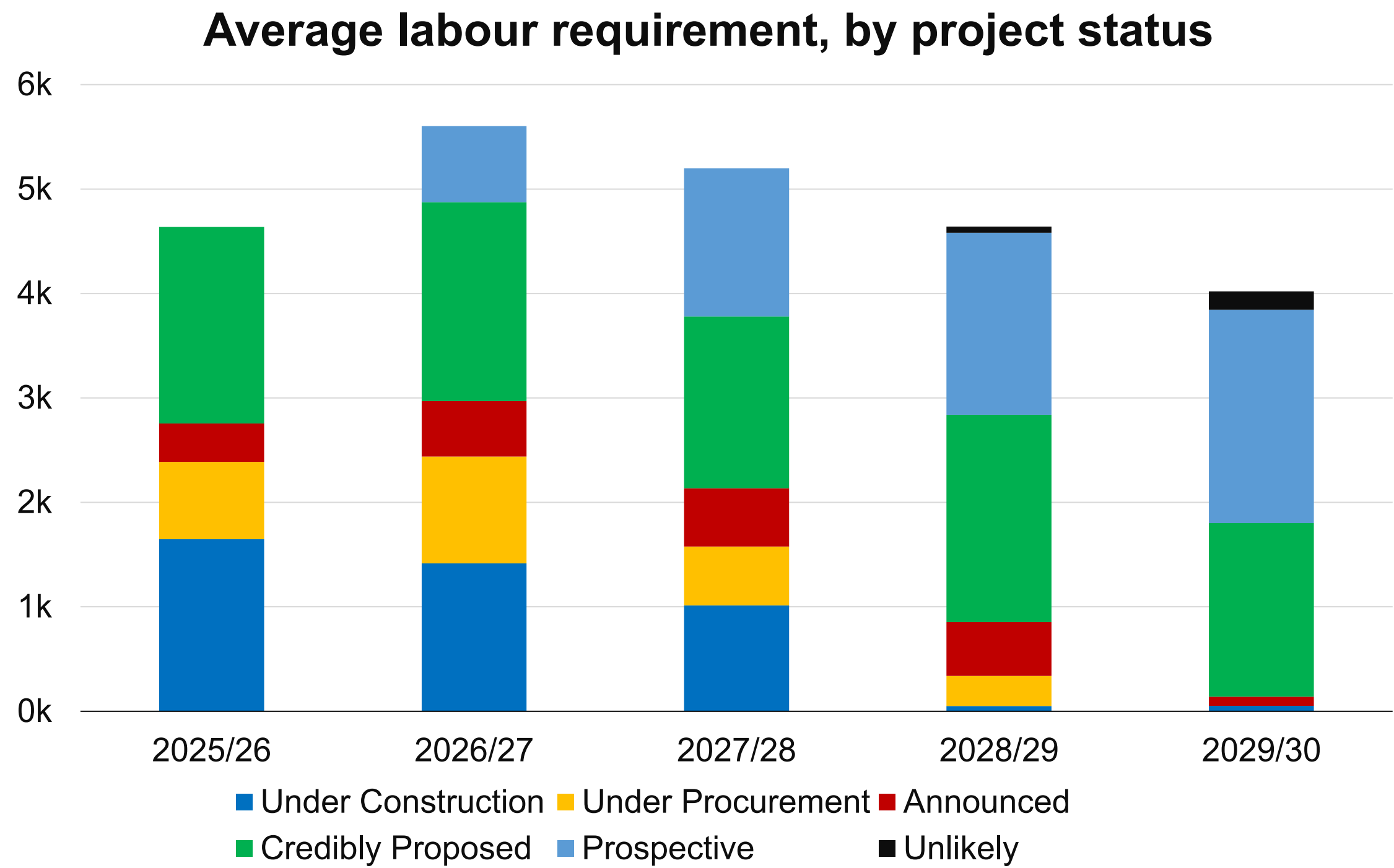

Average labour requirement, by funding status

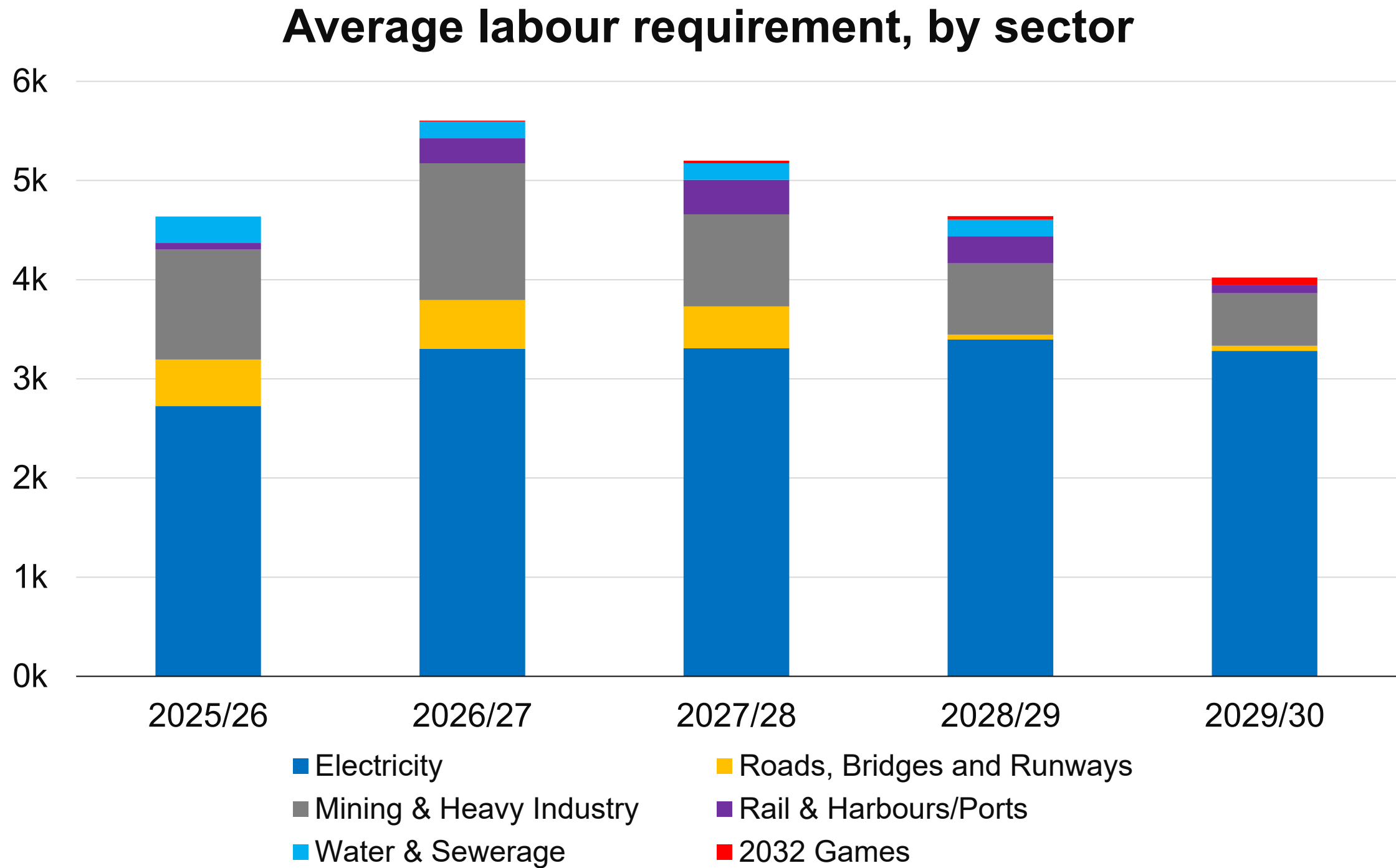

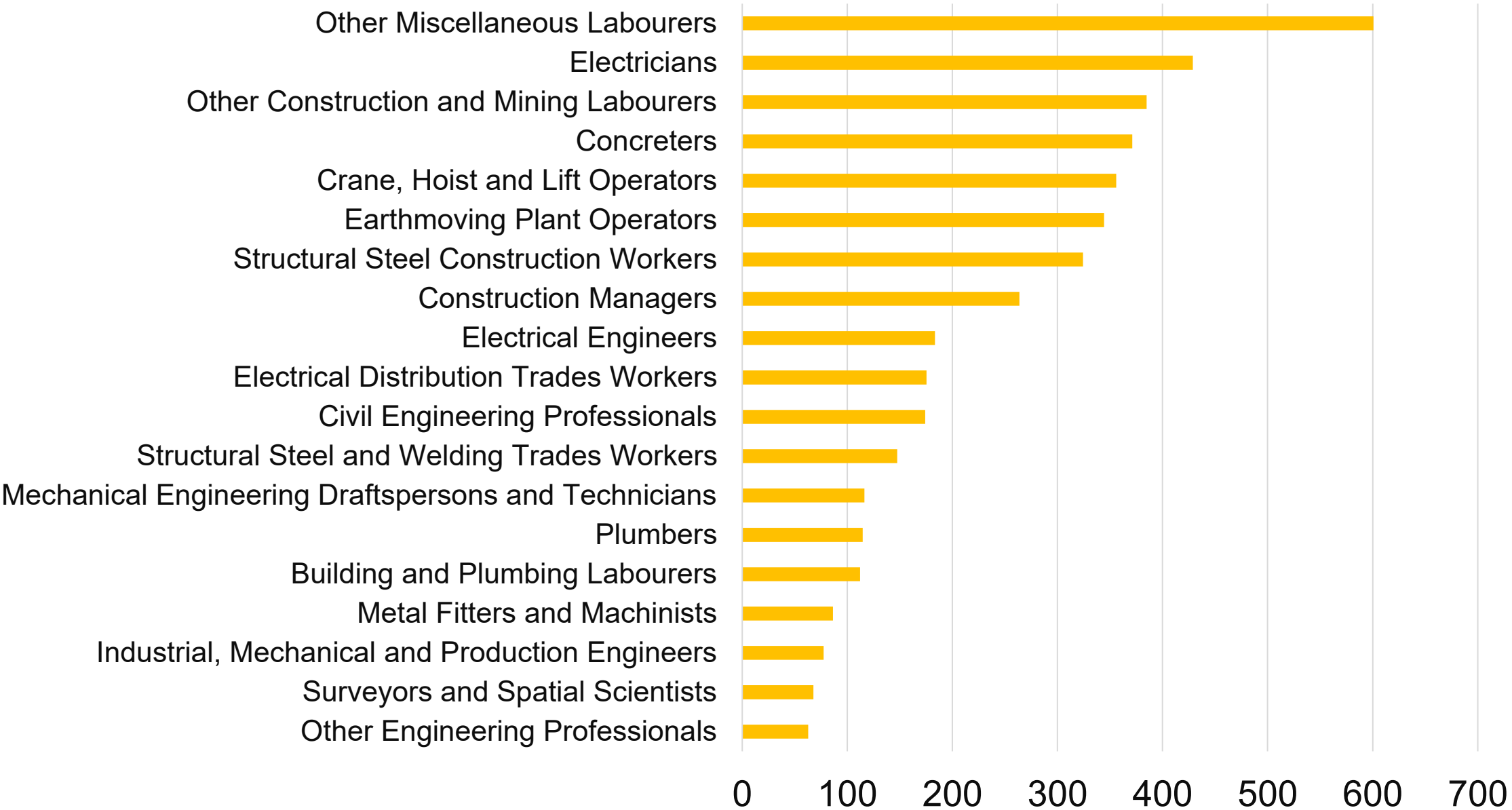


Average Labour Requirement: Central Queensland

(2025/26 to 2029/30)**

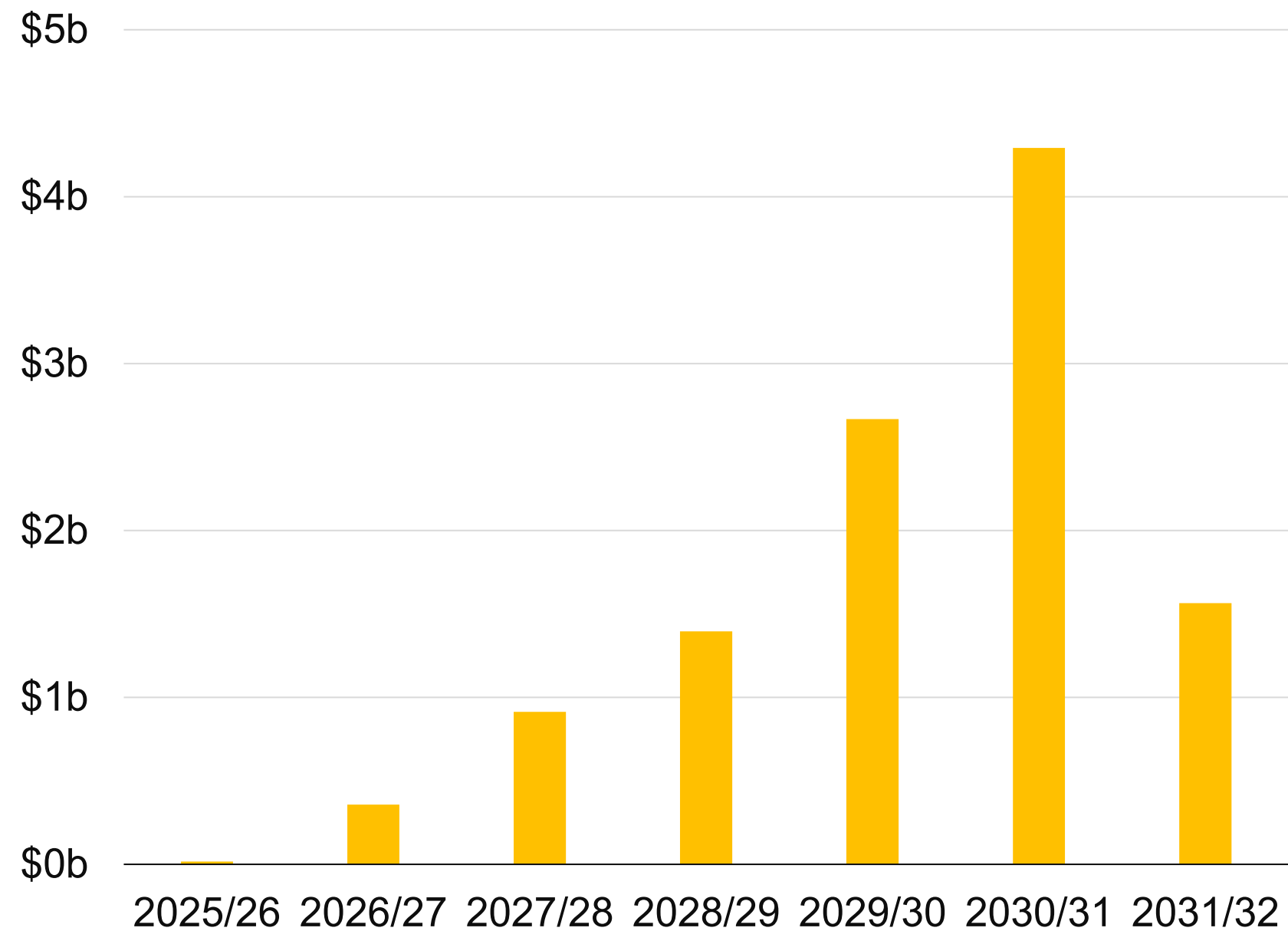

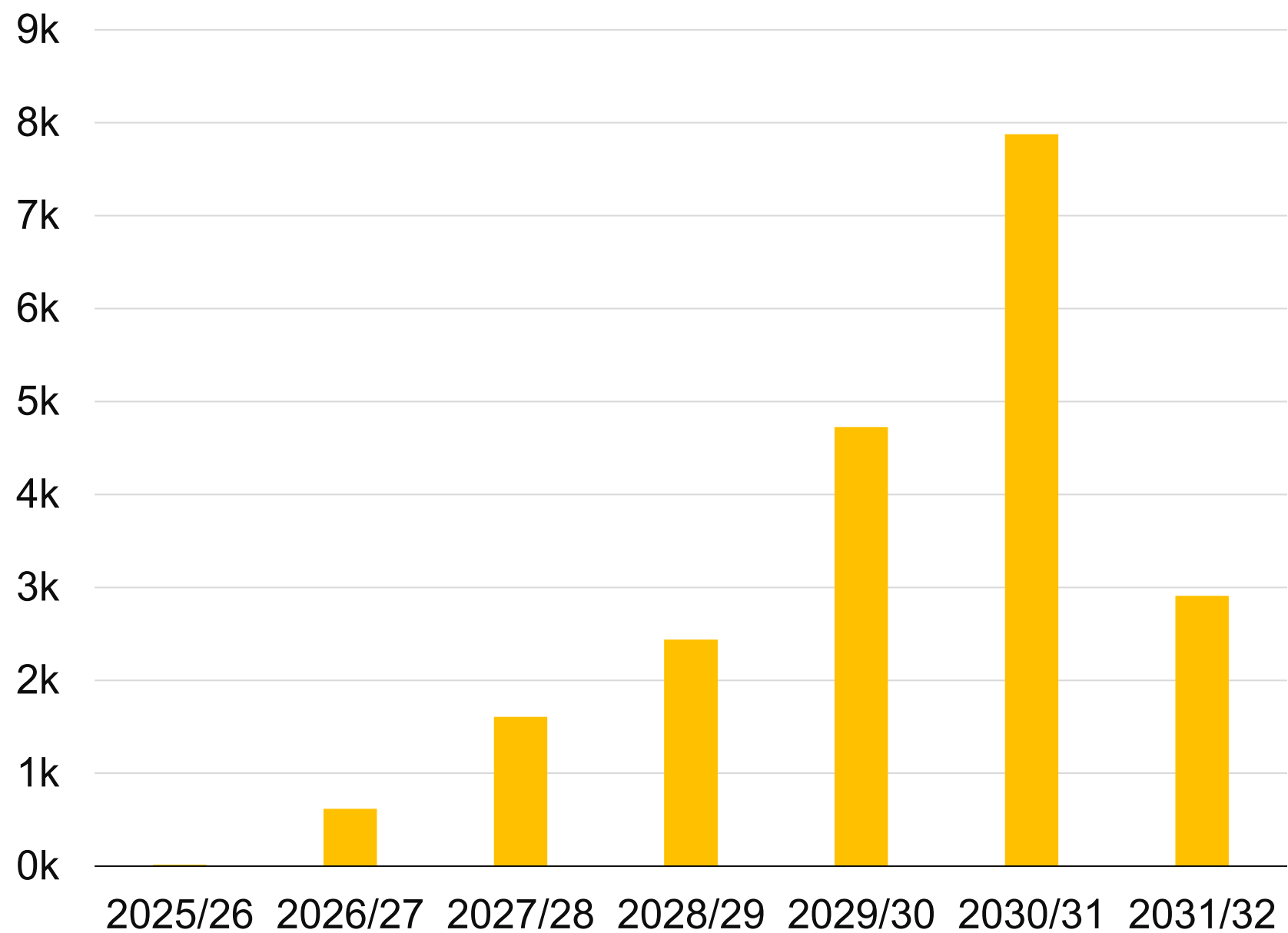
The 2032 Games venues & villages pipeline

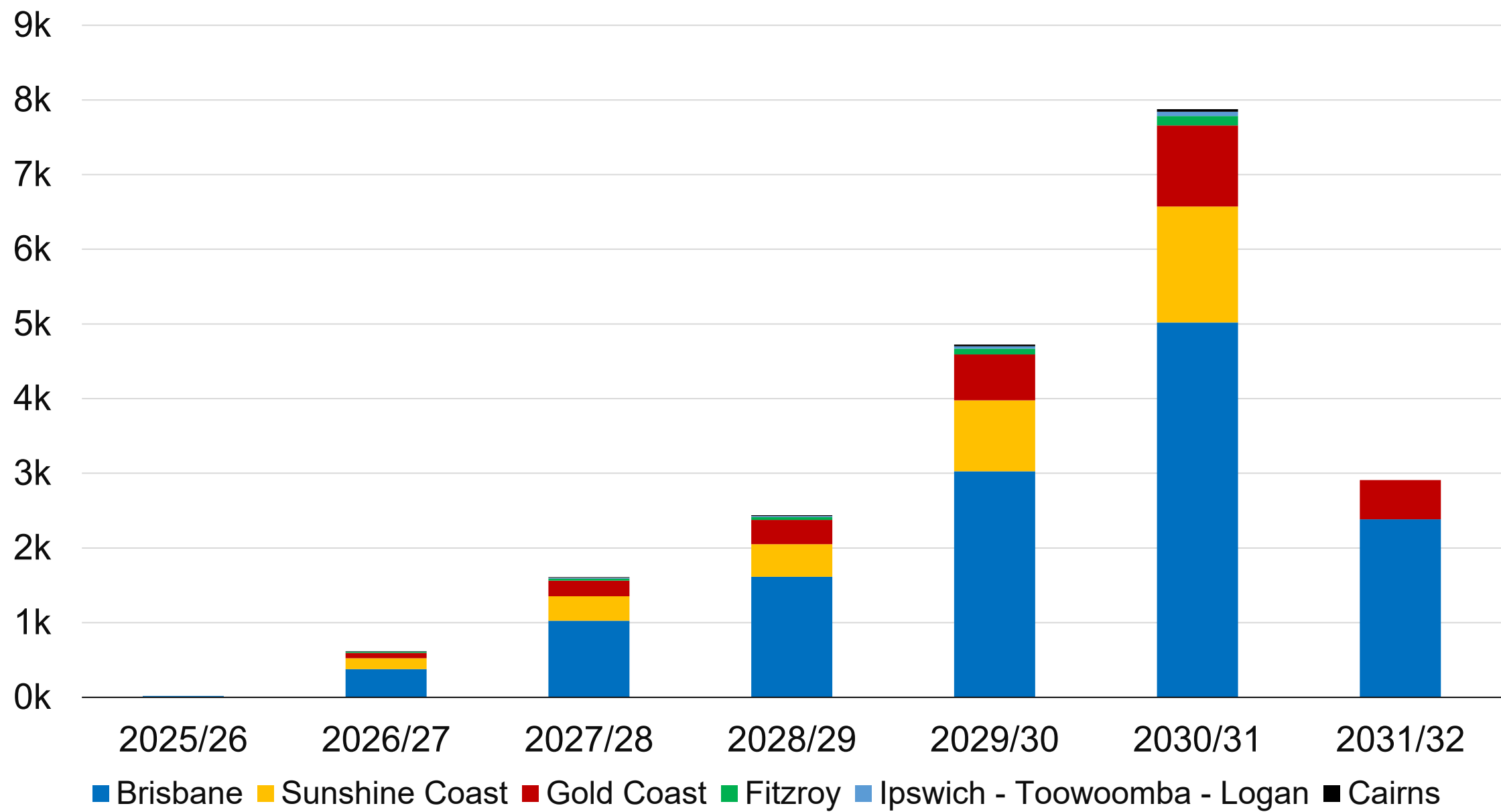
Average labour demand for the 2032 games, by financial year

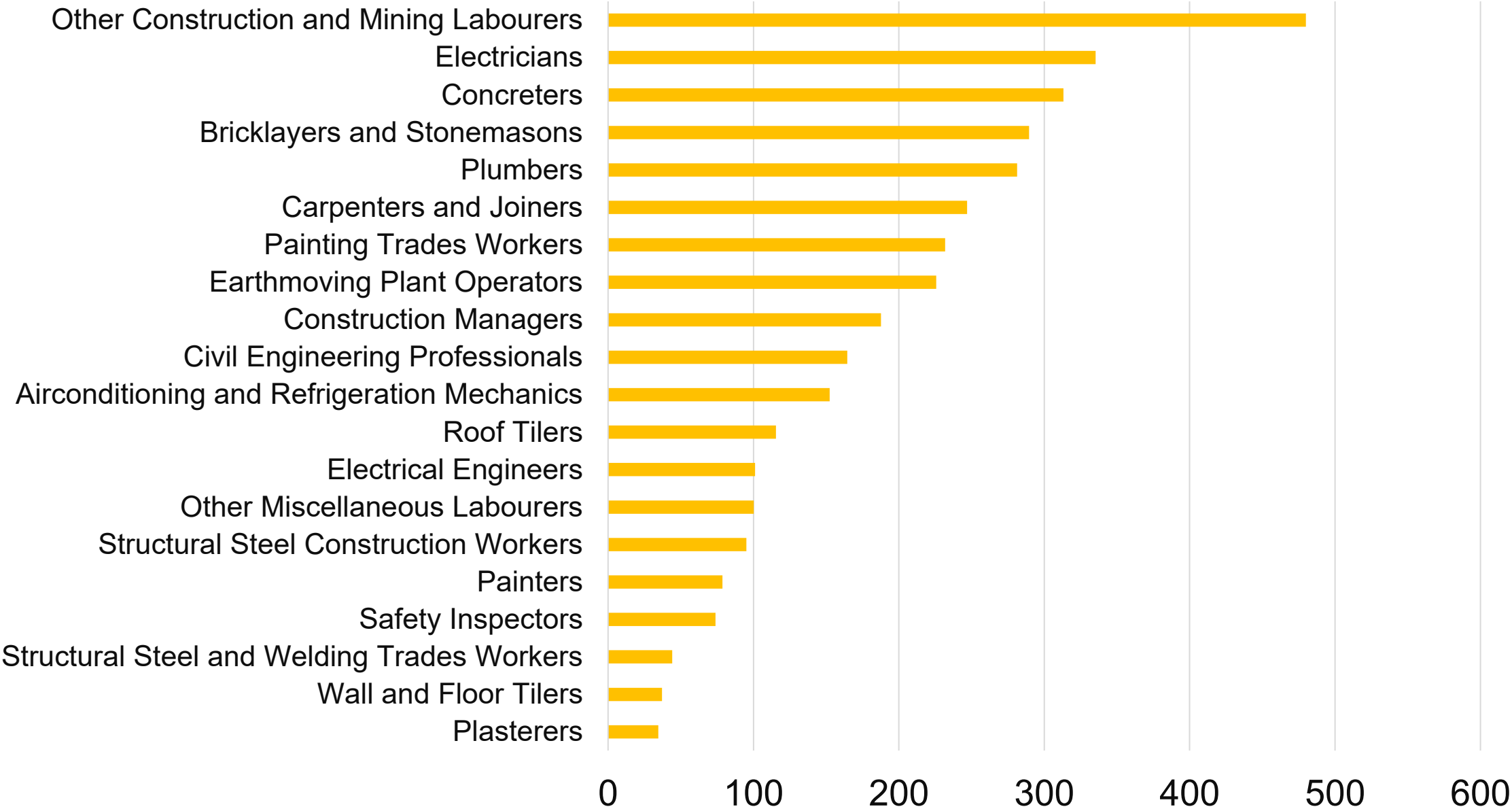
The 2032 Games – by region
